Climate For Change

PETRIE PARK AND RATTRAY RESERVE DRAFT MASTER PLANS

In January 2015, Council appointed SGL Consulting Group to work with the community and Council to develop a master plan for Petrie Park and Rattray Reserve, Montmorency. The draft plans are now ready for the final consultation phase.

It was resolved that Council:

- 1. Release the Petrie Park and Rattray Reserve draft master plans for the purpose of community consultation 8 March 19 April 2016
- 2. Invite community members to submit written submissions in relation to the draft plan via communication in the Leader Newspaper (Banyule in brief), Council's website,Facebook page, direct email to the user groups at Petrie Park and Rattray Reserve
- 3. Receive a further report following the community consultation period.

New homes for birds and bats

Did you know?

The tiny bats we sometimes see above our gardens can consume 1.200 mosquitos and other pest insects in one evening? Microbats are an unappreciated chemical-free method of pest control in gardens and on farms.

I discovered this surprising fact at the weekend at the nestbox making workshop. Participants were told about the importance of providing boxes for native species because of the loss of tree hollows that they traditionally used for their nests. We were provided with tools and a kit of pre- cut materials; we could take home our completed boxes and install them in our gardens.

At first we made a box designed for musk lorikeets. It looked great, but with dozens of musks already visiting my garden every day, I didn't think I needed to provide them with another home. Then we made a very different type of box – it was very narrow, with an opening underneath – designed to provide shelter for microbats. I was delighted to think I might be able to attract these tiny creatures to my garden, especially if they could keep the mosquitos under control! This box was proudly

Dogs in our nature reserves - What laws apply?

There has been some discussion recently about the rules relating to dogs in Montmorency's nature reserves. The Banyule City Council website tells us that dogs are allowed off-lead in our reserves, but this is on the condition that the dogs are always under the effective control of their owners. This means that dogs must be within clear view of their owner and must return to their owner upon command.

However, there are some environmentally sensitive parks and reserves in nearby suburbs which have special controls and signs have been erected to inform the public, eg Brown's Nature Reserve in Greensborough, St Helena Bush Reserve and Yandell Reserve.

Did you know that it is an offence not to clean up after your dog? It is also an offence not to have a receptacle for this purpose when walking your dog in a public place!

As research has shown that the presence of dogs has a negative effect on plants, wildlife and wetlands, dog owners need to know the importance of following the rules in order to minimise these effects.


