Community Veterans Mens' Shed



Normally each month we write a profile of a person that lives in or around Montmorency. This month we write about a group that is tucked away in Main Road.

The Community Veteran's Mens' Shed is a support group that is supported by the Greensborough RSL. It receives funding from Veterans affairs and exists to help support war veterans. Around 30

ex servicemen visit their home in Main Road, Lower Plenty each Monday and Wednesday. Here they can talk and work away on their various projects. They have a well equipped workshop with drills, planers and lathes which turn out an enormous range of wooden articles. Some are kept by the people making them but many are given away to needy groups.

The group was set up to provide a place where ex servicemen could meet and share their stories and their problems. Some come for a short period, others stay for years. All find the place a supporting environment. The group of the group is Lee Webb who is also president of the Greensborough RSL.

Last month the group worked on assembling 35 nesting boxes for our Sugar

Glider project. We had cut out the boxes, they then assembled them. Jane and I collected the boxes and were impressed with the workmanship. Lee complained that the pieces weren't cut exactly to size, but we felt that the sugar gliders wouldn't complain.

The Montmorency Community Group would like to thank them for their support in assembling the sugar glider boxes and wish them well for the future.

An abundance of lemons and winter greens, as well as amaranth seed and parsley and coriander were soon swapped and shared with delight. It's amazing how often I hear "Ooh I don't grow that, is it easy to grow, and could I have some?"

We also enjoyed the opportunity to have an encouraging demonstration by the wonderful Julie French on making a simple sauerkraut in a jar, using mostly arm power and a bit of salt to set it up. Julie also showed us a way to preserve lemons for use later in the year when they are not so abundant, and how to use them in a couscous for added yummy flavour. Thanks to Monty Primary School for their generous support, and for the use of their

buildings over the autumn and winter months.

From October we will be back at our sunny Were Street location in the park.

If you can come a little earlier to help with set up, that would be fab. Bring your excess seedlings, herbs or greens, or perhaps some jars or a recipe or worm tea to share. Get Up and Greenpeace have been recommending that Victorians 'make the switch' and change power companies as many providers have been trying to get rid of the RET (renewable energy target). Greenpeace have created a guide to help people understand what the different companies stance on green energy is so that people can choose their energy provider accordingly. Greenpeace have ranked Powershop as number one as it is owned by Meridian (100% renewable company) and it is the only company that is actively fighting to save the RET. I switched to Powershop for my electricity and to Red Energy for my gas.

I am looking for a 'homestay' host in the Banyule/ Nillumbik area for Abbas, a 24yo single man living on a bridging visa. A homestay host would need to provide a basic room with a bed and table and the opportunity to share household life and participate in social activities. I would recommend Abbas as a "house mate" as I have found him to be responsible, honest and trustworthy.

Abbas is a very polite, cooperative and respectful young man. He can speak, read and write English at a basic level, but his visa denies him the right to work, receive English lessons or undertake job training. Abbas has begun to attend a community school, which he will attend

on weekdays.

Abbas can pay for basic household expenses. He can cook for himself if needed and help with house cleaning, dish washing and food shopping.

This would be a private arrangement, not arranged through an agency such as ASRC. I have accommodated 2 young men in similar situations before, and I could provide support to the homestay host if needed.



Lunch with a difference

On Friday August 29th, 102 people gathered for lunch at Bridges Restaurant in a beautiful bush setting just out of Hurstbridge. They had come together to support asylum seekers who must rely on charity for even their most basic needs. In this pleasant atmosphere over a delicious meal, the it was difficult to imagine the situation faced by asylum seekers living in the same city- unable to work, unable to study or to get their claims for refugee status assessed-and in particular to those locked up in detention centres both in Australia and in Nauru and Manus Island. Organised by the MASSG, this event was held in support of the food bank at the ASRC (Asylum Seeker Resource Centre) and a total of nearly \$2000 was raised.

After lunch, they heard from Sameneh, a young woman from Iran, who is now living in Melbourne on a bridging visa, which does not allow her or her husband to work, forcing them to rely on a small government allowance and charity. Sameneh told how she and her husband escaped from Iran to avoid religious persecution, with only 3 days warning that her husband was to be imprisoned or worse, as punishment for changing his religion. She described their difficult time in Indonesia and the terrifying boat trip from there. She mentioned her experience of detention on Christmas Island and in Adelaide, which was too dreadful to describe in detail. Sameneh's future goal is to use her academic qualifications and experience in English language and teaching to contribute to the Australian community.
